The Focus Four Hazards



▶ Falls

Falls from elevation account for one-third of all deaths in construction.



▶ Electrocutions

Approximately 350 electrical related fatalities occur each year.



▶ Struck-by: equipment & vehicles

1 in 4 struck-by vehicle deaths involve construction workers—more than any other occupation.



▶ Caught-in: trenching, excavation, confined space

The fatality rate for excavation work is 112% higher than the rate for general construction.

The SBCTC's Focus on Safety 2-day interactive training includes:

- ▶ hazard awareness identification
- ▶ Cal/OSHA compliance information
- ▶ new training materials: Power Point, factsheets, case studies
- ▶ cross-training with people from other crafts for better on-the-job communication
- ▶ tips & techniques on effectively teaching this information to others
- ▶ hands-on interactive training

NOTE: The OSHA 10 and OSHA 30 curricula have been revised to include mandatory training time on the Focus Four Hazards. This course offers useful resources and effective training practices to help you address the new requirements.
